STATEMENT FROM EXECUTIVE OFFICER

AKC has been on an upward trajectory in fundraising and grant giving in the last five years, raising more funds each year and distributing more funds to children. Yay. What we do as a social business is quite unique. We raise funds by asking artists to donate artwork, and we auction the artworks at our annual auction. With the funds raised, we pay directly to children's teachers and schools, the fees for said classes.

We pay funds raised directly to children's teachers and schools for the fees of said classes. These payments for classes, lessons and sessions make a difference.

The payments enable children who would otherwise miss-out - be socially engaged in the arts. They can go to ballet, they can go to music class, they can do art classes - they can do stuff - the stuff that makes childhood memories happy. All at AKC, are dedicated and proud to carry the mantle of its founders and early contributors and we rely on a dedicated committee to keep things on track.

In the 2020 Annual Report, we also want to say that, given the COVID outbreak in early 2020, we have seen a great reduction of grant applications. Our grants given in 2020 reduced by more than 50%.

It is also important to acknowledge the Collie Foundation - a new and major supporter of our **artsbus** program.

IN SUMMARY OUR FINANCIALS LOOKED LIKE THE FOLLOWING:

- Income
 - Received JobKeeper \$6,000
 - Auction sales down by 38.9%, FY20 \$92,000; FY19 were \$150,615
 - Major Grant Received for artsbus \$70,000 (Collie Foundation)
 - Auction Merchandise sale down by 32% FY20 \$2,406; FY 19 \$3,543
 - Total Income for FY20 \$195,985.52 up around 3% from last year
 - Donations reached \$13,556.90, including local Government and community grants.
- Expenses
 - Total Cost of Sales \$41,028.52
 - One part time Employee from November 2019
 - Total operating expenses \$108,411.23 up by around 10% from last year.
 - Total grants approved slowed down due to COVID 19, and were down by 59% when compared to FY19. (FY20 \$40,082 compared with FY19 \$96,702).
- Net Profit:
 - o \$67,065
 - Received \$70,000 artsbus grant not had a chance to buy key asset (the bus)
 - We disbursed less grants this year due to Covid 19
- Net assets: \$113,932.60





All grant applications are considered, firstly for suitability by the Grants Administrator and then at a monthly Committee Meeting. Should an application be considered urgent, AKC will always consider the application as a priority.






The majority of our grants for individual applicants are given to children who live in single parent/carer families, and the data we keep, reflects this. It is also very common that children have multiple reasons why our grants are required.

17% of our grants were given to children who recognise as being Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander. In FY 2019, 13.5% of grants were granted to children who recognise as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.

This statistic is reliant on information provided to AKC at the time of application.



artsbus

The **artsbus** emerged as an idea for AKC to create its own program that is mobile and can reach out to kids who need our support. A grant of \$5000 in 2018 from the Palais Theatre enabled us to trial the **artsbus**, we are forever grateful for the contribution made by the Palais Theatre.





artsbus

After the successful trial of the **artsbus** in 2018 - 2019, we were successful gaining significant funding from the Collie Foundation. The Collie Foundation funded the **artsbus** for \$150,000 over three years. The funding will enable us to buy and fit-out a bus and employ a part-time program manager and facilitate programs across Melbourne and into regional Victoria.

AKC was also successful in late 2019 in receiving an \$8,000 grant from the City of Port Phillip - a Covid Quick Response Art Grant to be used to run Artist Lead workshops with children living in public social housing in South Melbourne. Covid restrictions have meant the grant will be used in FY2021.

"It's amazing having the guided, but also unstructured art activities. It is giving kids what they need, as it does not always need to be too guided. It is empowering for these kids to make their own choices."



The 2019 AKC Annual Art Auction was held at the Park in Albert park for the second year in a row. Returning to the same amazing venue for the second year was very popular with our audience. A fabulous event took place and we had art sales of over \$100,000.

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
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
